FIXING OUR STREETS

THE CITYWIDE STREET REHAB AND MAINTENANCE PROJECT



The City continues to make great strides in improving our infrastructure with our Street Rehabilitation and Maintenance Program.

A total of 61 street segments have been improved since January 2025, including 27 that were previously in very poor condition. These ongoing measures prevent further deterioration that would require more costly future repairs. In total, the project includes the application of over 957,000 square feet of slurry seal and more than 2 million square feet of mill and overlay work!

This construction phase will be completed by May 2026 at a cost of \$3.9 million. Funding comes from a combination of sources outside

of our General Fund (your tax dollars), including Senate Bill 1 (SB1), TransNet, Measure T Sales Tax funds, and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Please include a picture of our road crews making repairs.

The impact of these improvements extends well beyond smoother pavement. Residents can expect better driving conditions, reduced vehicle wear-and-tear, and improved accessibility throughout neighborhoods.

In total, the project includes the application of over 957,000 square feet of slurry seal and more than 2 million square feet of mill and overlay work. The City will soon be launching the next phase of roadway improvements in July.

As the City continues to invest in its infrastructure, projects like this reinforce the City's commitment to maintaining safe and reliable roadways.

DEPUTY OF THE YEAR NOMINATION DEPUTY JOSÉ ALMARAZ MACIAS



On March 11, 2026, Deputy José Almaraz Macias of the Lemon Grove COPPS Unit was on patrol near Lemon Grove Academy's middle and elementary schools when he encountered an adult male suffering from a life-threatening stab wound. The victim was losing blood rapidly and fading in and out of consciousness.

Deputy Almaraz Macias acted immediately. He applied a tourniquet and delivered critical lifesaving care, while securing an unstable scene with a violent suspect still at large. His swift, decisive actions were the determining factor that saved a life.

The suspect fled the scene, triggering a multi-jurisdictional pursuit ending in his capture on Interstate 8. The suspect was taken into custody and charged with attempted murder.

Deputy José Almaraz Macias demonstrated exceptional courage, composure, and professionalism under extreme pressure. His actions not only saved a life but ensured a dangerous suspect was brought to justice reflecting the highest standards in service to the Lemon Grove community.
