CHECK IT: AB 413



As of January 1, 2025, California's "Daylighting" law prohibits parking within 20 feet of any crosswalk, marked or unmarked. This law applies to all intersections in the state, including Lemon Grove.

How does this law improve safety?

The law aims to improve traffic safety and save lives by making crosswalks more visible for drivers and pedestrians. This also makes it easier for drivers to see people crossing the street.

How does this law apply in Lemon Grove?

The law applies to all curbs, whether there is a red curb or no parking signage at the intersection.

Vehicles stored longer than 72 hours without being moved at least one tenth of a mile are subject to being cited or towed. Deputies are set to inform prior to enforcing.

What's the law's official name?

The law's official name is Assembly Bill 413 (AB 413)

THE BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM



The San Diego County Sheriff's Department, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors, and the San Diego County Chiefs of Police and Sheriff Association, along with community advocacy groups, developed the San Diego Blue Envelope Program to assist with safe

and successful community interactions. The Blue Envelope Program provides individuals with blue envelopes and/or wearable products with the program logo which allow the individual to identify themselves to law enforcement as having a condition or disability which may impact communication or require additional accommodation or awareness during an interaction.

The logo offers the opportunity for the law enforcement officer to be aware that varied communication methods may be needed to effectively communicate with the person displaying the logo, or that the individual may have medical conditions which may require an accommodation. The goal of this program is to encourage positive and effective interactions between law enforcement and the public.

HOW IT WORKS

The Blue Envelope Program works by allowing an individual to readily display the Blue Envelope logo or present a Blue Envelope upon contact with law enforcement or other community service personnel. The Blue Envelope-branded products can contain the individual's identification, contact information or pertinent vehicle operating documents such as the vehicle registration and proof of insurance.

The Blue Envelope Program does not have a registry component; therefore, the program is voluntary and self-implemented.
